LAS VEGAS, NV — Every cat at Homeward Bound Cat Adoptions is waiting for a family, but some have waited far longer than others. That's why the spotlight is on 13 specific cats (including one bonded pair) who have spent months in the adoption center—in hopes of helping them find the loving homes they deserve.

"These are wonderful cats who are simply being overlooked," said Vanessa Porter, Executive Director for Homeward Bound Cat Adoptions. "They're the quiet ones, the shy ones, and those with manageable medical conditions. In a shelter environment, they don't always stand out, but we know firsthand how much love they have to give."

While the adoption center provides comfortable accommodations, shelter life is no substitute for a home. Cats that are naturally reserved often struggle to relax in a busy environment, making it even more difficult for potential adopters to see their true personalities. Homeward Bound hopes the community will help change that by sharing their stories and encouraging friends and family to visit.

Shmi (5 years) – Arrived January 7. Thanks to a generous sponsor, Shmi's adoption fee has been covered. This gentle, quiet cat loves other cats and would thrive in a calm home.

Nigel (7 years) – Arrived February 9. After surviving nearly two years outdoors, including eight months living in a storm drain, Nigel is learning to trust people again and is looking for a patient adopter.

Derick (8 years) – Arrived February 16. A sweet, toothless senior who enjoys peaceful companionship and quiet afternoons.
